Elon Academy provides a comprehensive support system for students including three consecutive summer residential programs providing both the academic & university life experience. Additionally, Scholars engage in monthly Saturday academies, a Transitions to College program, & are provided support by mentors & academic coaches. Once in college, ongoing holistic support is provided by Peer Leaders & in collaboration with their universities to ensure success throughout their college journey.
